

2007 PREVAILING WINDS II INFORMATION AND RESERVATION FORM



This is your invitation to the Prevailing Winds II 2007 sailing season. Attached you will find a reservation form for you to complete and return. Our reservations are based on a first come, first reserve with deposit basis. (Reservations are not held without a deposit)

The Prevailing Winds II is a custom designed 47 foot ketch which sleeps 20 people (this includes a Coast Guard licensed Captain and a First Mate). A minimum of three adults must accompany the unit that reserves the vessel. These adults are responsible for the youth participants at all times under the guidance of the Captain and First Mate. The Captain and First Mate are responsible for the safe operation of the vessel and its passengers as deemed by the United States Coast Guard.

The Prevailing Winds II is licensed by the State of Michigan Department of Consumer and Industry Services as a traveling long-term camp, and meets Boy Scouts of America, as well as United States Coast Guard regulations. Most trips take participants into the Canadian waters of Northern Lake Huron. Other popular destinations

include: Mackinac Straits area, Les Cheneaux Islands area, and Northern Lake Michigan. All itineraries are arranged with the Captain by May of 2006 and are also dependent on wind and other weather conditions.

The minimum age requirement for Boy Scouts is 13 years of age by January 1st, 2007 or be an Explorer or Venturer. All groups participating in the Prevailing Winds II program must be registered Boy Scout Troops, Venturing Crews or Explorer Posts of the Boy Scouts of America. Parents attending with youth does not waive this requirement.

The fees are \$1,250 for weekend trips and \$4,900 for week-long trips. Fees include: sleeping berths for 15 youth and 3 adults (a group may have more adults but no more than the number of youth, (ex. 7 adults 11 youth), docking, sanitation fees, fuel, maintenance, Captain, First Mate, and a sailing adventure of a lifetime.

Fees do not include food. Each unit plans its own menu and brings their own food pre-approved for your trip (menu and meal suggestions will be provided). An alcohol stove and an electric skillet (in port) are available in the Galley for cooking. Your meal plans must include feeding the Captain and the First Mate.

Reservations require a \$350 deposit for weekend cruises and a \$700 deposit for week long cruises. Weekend cruises will leave out of East Tawas, Rogers City or in the vicinity. All week-long cruises will leave from our summer home port in Rogers City. All fees paid are non-refundable unless a group is scheduled to replace your reservation. A payment schedule is listed on the reservation form, and due to our demand for cruises, will be adhered to or your reservation will be opened to those groups with the ability to pay.
