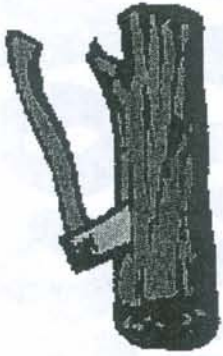

What is **WOOD BADGE** ?

WOOD BADGE is an ultimate Scout leader training experience originated by Baden-Powell, founder of the Scouting movement. "One of the purposes of **WOOD BADGE** training is to get people to think about the practice of Scouting, to meet together, to exchange experiences and to live together in the Spirit of the Scout Oath."

What does **WOOD BADGE** consist of?

WOOD BADGE is six days to experience the learning and practicing of Leadership skills. The first part of the course reflects unit meetings, while the second part uses a unit camping activity. You do not need to be an experienced camper to participate. We will provide enough help for you to enjoy the experience.

As a result of your participation, you will view Scouting as a family of interrelated programs that provide age- appropriate activities for youth. You will apply the skills you learn as a member of a successful working team. You will revitalize your commitment by sharing in an overall inspirational experience that will help provide Scouting with the leadership it needs to accomplish its mission on an ongoing basis.

Who may attend **WOOD BADGE** ?

Any adult Cub, Boy or Venture Scout leader may attend **WOOD BADGE**. Assistant Scoutmasters may be 18 years of age or older. All other Scouters must be 21 years of age or older. All participants must have completed Basic Leader training for their current position. Scoutmasters, Assistant Scoutmasters and Venturing leaders must also have completed the Outdoor Experience training.

What is the Cost?

The Early Bird course fee will be \$175.00 if paid in full by May 15, 2007. If not paid in full by May 15, 2007 the fee will be \$200.00. So get those applications and fees in early and save \$25.00! All applications must be accompanied by a \$75 deposit. Then an additional payment of \$100.00 is due by May 1, 2007. Remember this is the Early Bird payment plan! After May 15, 2007, the course fee is \$200 total. Some partial scholarships, based on need, are available.

What do I need to bring?

Everything is furnished for the course except your personal gear and uniforms. An equipment and uniform list will be mailed to you upon receipt of your application and deposit. The course furnishes food, a neckerchief, program materials, a notebook, recognition, etc.

Who will staff the course?

WOOD BADGE staff are the best volunteer trainers available from the Blue Water and Tall Pine Councils. These Scouters are recognized as highly qualified, experienced Scouting trainers. They will be under the direction of Miles A. Lombard, Course Director.
